THE BOOK OF REVELATION

THE BOOK OF REVELATION

The Book of Revelation, also known as the Apocalypse (from the Greek word, Apokálypsis, which means lifting of the veil, or finding out something secret), is the final book of the Bible and contains a series of prophetic visions concerning the end of times. It is traditionally attributed to John, the Apostle who wrote it while exiled on the island of Patmos. The book is written in highly symbolic and metaphoric language, describing the ultimate victory of good over evil.

Key Themes and Structure:

- **Introduction**. John receives a vision of Christ instructing him to write letters to seven churches in Asia Minor which are both commendations and warnings to remain faithful;
- **Heavenly Throne Room.** John is taken to a vision of God's throne room. A scroll with seven seals is introduced, which only the Lamb (Jesus) is worthy to open;
- The Seven Seals. As each seal is opened, various judgements are unleashed on earth (war, famine, death and natural disasters). The 7th seal introduces the 7 trumpets;
- The Seven Trumpets. Each brings further judgements plagues, demonic forces, and cosmic disturbances symbolizing the increasing intensity of God's wrath;
- The woman, the Dragon & the Beasts. Introduces symbolic characters a woman (the church), a dragon (Satan), and 2 beasts (world powers and false prophets);
- The Seven bowls of Wrath. Seven angels pour out bowls of God's wrath upon earth bringing plagues & disasters and escalates the destruction and judgement on the wicked;
- The Fall of Babylon. Represents a corrupt and evil world system that is judged and destroyed signaling the end of earthly powers that oppose God;
- The final Battle & Judgement. Christ returns in glory, defeats the forces of evil and binds Satan for 1000 years. Then the final judgement where the dead are resurrected and judged, the righteous are granted eternal life and the wicked face eternal punishment;
- The new Heaven & New Earth. God creates a new heaven and earth where there is no more suffering, death or sin and God dwells with his people forever.



Whether his prayer was answered by the saint, or it would have happened anyway, soon he was a star on radio and television.

He felt empathy for cancer-stricken children and raised funds to build a hospital where they would be treated for free. "No child should die in the dawn of life," was his motto. Many stars from all areas of show business gave their time to help and in 1962 he was able to open the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis.


Charity Appeal: Mike Smith

Saint Therese of the Child Jesus By Mike Paterson– Lecturer

Saint Therese of the Child Jesus, often referred to as "The Little Flower," holds a special place in the hearts of Catholics worldwide. Born as Marie-Françoise-Thérèse Martin on January 2, 1873, in Alençon, France, she is known for her deep spiritual insights, simplicity, and humility. Despite

her short life of just 24 years and relatively limited experiences in a cloistered Carmelite convent, St. Therese's wisdom and devotion to God have become timeless sources of inspiration for the faithful.
